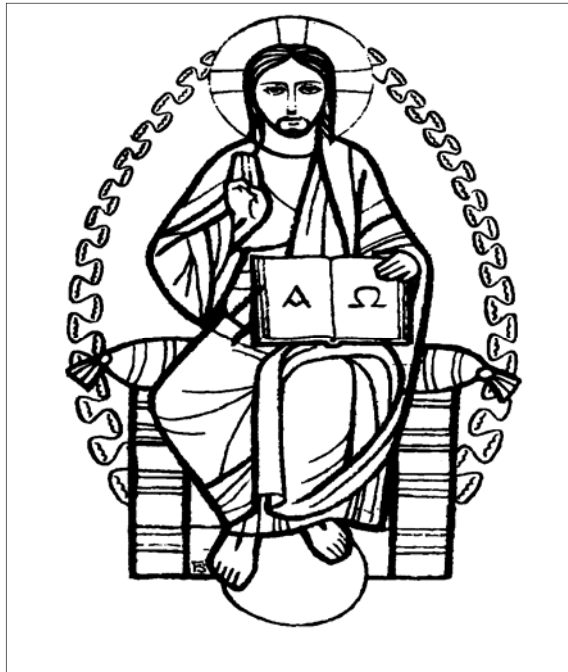

First Reading *Wisdom 3.1-9*

A reading from the Book of Wisdom

But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God,
and no torment will ever touch them.

In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and
their departure was thought to be a disaster,
and their going from us to be their destruction; but they
are at peace. For though in the sight of others they were
punished, their hope is full of immortality.

Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great
good, because God tested them and found them worthy
of himself; like gold in the furnace he tried them, and
like a sacrificial burnt offering he accepted them.

In the time of their visitation they will shine forth, and
will run like sparks through the stubble. They will
govern nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord will
reign over them forever. Those who trust in him will
understand truth, and the faithful will abide with him in
love, because grace and mercy are upon his holy ones,
and he watches over his elect.

John 5.19-24

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to the crowd, "Very truly, I tell you, the Son can do nothing on his own, but only what he sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, the Son does likewise. The Father loves the Son and shows him all that he himself is doing; and he will show him greater works than these, so that you will be astonished. Indeed, just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whomever he wishes. The Father judges no one but has given all judgment to the Son, so that all may honour the Son just as they honour the Father. Anyone who does not honour the Son does not honour the Father who sent him. Very truly, I tell you, anyone who hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life, and does not come under judgment, but has passed from death to life. Very truly, I tell you, the hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live."

President We praise and bless you, loving Father,

this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many

Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.
So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,
in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice
made once for all upon the cross.
Bringing before you the bread of life and cup
of salvation,
we proclaim his death and resurrection
until he comes in glory.

Lord Jesus, come in glory.**

The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed

President Glory and honour and power:
are yours by right, O Lord our God;

are yours by right, O Lamb who was slain:

God a kingdom of priests from every race
and language, from every people and nation.**

The names of those to be remembered are read aloud

After the names have been read

President Rest eternal grant to them, O Lord:
All **and let light perpetual shine upon them.**

The Choir sings "In paradisum":

In paradisum deducant te angeli:
in tuo adventu suscipiant te martyres,
et perducant te in civitatem sanctum Ierusalem.
Chorus angelorum te suscipiat,
et cum Lazaro quondam paupere,
aeternam habeas requiem.

*May the angels receive you in paradise;
may the martyrs receive you as you arrive,
and bring you into the holy city of Jerusalem.
May the choir of angels receive you,
and with Lazarus, once a beggar,
may you have eternal rest.*

President Grant to us, Lord God,
to trust you not for ourselves alone,
but for those also whom we love
and who are hidden from us by the shadow of
death;
that, as we believe your power to have raised
our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead,
so may we trust your love to give eternal life
to all who believe in him;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you
and the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.
