My DEAR FRIENDS,

There are so many accounts this month that there is not much space for anything else, so I must only say very few words. The accounts will, I feel sure, be read with interest, especially as they show an improvement of more than £100 on the previous year, but this includes a grant of £50 from outside. The deficit of £50 on the Church Expenses Fund has been reduced to a little over £6; and the Electric Light Debt has been entirely cleared off. The Missionary Societies, the C.M.S., S.P.G., C. & C.C.S. all show an increase in receipts. The Nurse Fund needs larger support and I hope that this year will see it with a stronger subscription list.

The Nurse made 444 visits last month.

I should like to draw special attention to the Horticultural Show, which is to take place on the second Wednesday in July. The Committee are making a determined effort to make it a success, and have had some difficulties to contend with. These I hope are melting away, and that this old and useful Society will meet with the liberal support it deserves. It has done most excellent work for a great many years, not only in encouraging the cultivation of flowers, fruits and vegetables, but in bringing about the improvement of allotments and cottage gardens, and helping to create a taste for flowers amongst Additional subscriptions will be the children. most thankfully welcomed by the Committee.

The Offertories on Whit Sunday will be for the Bishop of London's Fund. The Bishop writes, making a very strong appeal for support, and adds: "I should not know, as Bishop, where to turn to find money for Churches, and clergy to man those Churches, but for this Fund."

There will be the usual Intercession for Missions on the 29th at the Mission Room. Miss Hemery asks me to say there will be no meetings in June, July, and August.

There will be a meeting in connection with the Bible Society in the Mission Room on the 29th inst., at 3.30. Two speakers are expected. The meeting will be interesting and the object is one of the best.
