My DEAR PEOPLE,

On the first Sunday in this month (October 3rd) our thoughts and prayers will be centred on Ernest Richard Milton, who on that day is being Ordained to the Holy Office of a Priest. May he be filled with all spiritual power through the Holy Ghost, received by the imposition of the Bishop's hands. It will no doubt come as a surprise to many to hear that during his holiday Mr. Milton has taken unto himself a wife. I am sure you will all join with me in wishing Mr. and Mrs. Milton a long and happy married life.

The Thanksgiving Service for the Harvest will take place on Sunday, October 10th. It being the second Sunday in the month, there will be an additional Celebration of the Holy Communion at 7 a.m., and in order to meet the needs of any who through age or infirmity cannot be present at one of the early Celebrations, there will be a Celebration immediately after the morning service. I hope we may have the same liberal supply of flowers, fruit, vegetables and bread for the decoration of the Church. These should be sent to the Church quite by half-past ten on the previous Saturday morning. You will also rememember that there is a Children's Flower Service in the afternoon; the offerings of fruit, vegetables, eggs, jams, etc., at this service will be sent to the local hospital. Collections will be divided between the usual institutions.

Under the Parish News you will notice that we are once more reviving daily Matins and Evensong, and a service on Wednesdays at 8 o'clock in the evening. I do hope that many will find time to come to these services. I feel that if more would make an effort to attend the daily

Celebration of the Holy Communion, and will make reasonable use of these further opportunities for prayer and intercession, a much more spiritual atmosphere would be created in the parish than is at present in evidence.

The Working Party is at present very busy preparing for its Annual Sale of Work on Wednesday, October 27th. The members are endeavouring to place on the stalls goods suitable for Christmas presents. I hope that we shall have a large number of buyers. The sale will be open till about 8 o'clock and there will be a concert at half-past six. Mrs. Harvey will be grateful for gifts for the various stalls; they should be sent to the Vicarage quite by Monday, October 25th.

Mr. Arthur Nightingale, who has been connected with the Church Lads' Brigade and has held a lieutenant's commission for some time, has resigned his position, as he has been married and has gone to live at Richmond. He has done much useful work in many of the other parochial activities. We shall miss him very much, but we wish him and his wife every happiness in their newly-formed home life.

The Church Lads' Brigade is still struggling on. In Mr. Harbor we have a lieutenant who will soon gain the affection of the lads, and I hope that many recruits will be added to our Company in the near future. We are at the moment in need of a captain. There may be someone in the Parish who is a lover of lads and who would like to offer his services as captain of the oldest organisation for lads within the Church. To such a one I should extend a very warm welcome if he would come and see me.
